The conflict between Israel and Palestine can be considered the most intractable conflict in the world that began in the early 20th century. It is part of the broader Arab-Israeli conflict. At the same time they defend that they should not have built that barrier because it makes it difficult for them to go from one place to another to do their routines.

They also tend to claim that they are the victims and that they felt compelled to do so and had no other alternative.
